Our pookaaiks are happier and healthier when they can safely do the things they love to do! Vaccines help make that possible.

Did you know that children under the age of 12 make up the largest number of new COVID cases in Canada?

On Siksika Nation, more than 30% of new COVID cases (33.1% as of Dec. 2, 2021) are in children under the age of 12.

Most cases of COVID-19 in children are milder than adults, but some kids can get very sick, and even have long-lasting symptoms ("Long COVID"). And, kiddos can spread the virus even if they don't have symptoms, and potentially

put friends, family or community members at risk.

There are many benefits for pookaaiks (children) to receive the COVID vaccine check out the poster for some examples.

Siksika Health Services recommends that people get fully vaccinated against COVID-19 as soon as they are eligible. This includes pookaaiks (children) ages 5 and up. While kiddos have a lower risk of severe illness, vaccines offer the best protection from getting or spreading COVID-19.

First, second, and third dose COVID-19 immunization is available on Siksika for eligible Siksika Nation members, weekdays at the Deerfoot Sportsplex (no appointments required).


Siksika Health CEO, Dr. Tyler White was appointed to the CPSA Council in early 2021 to expand services, create partnerships, and improve healthcare.

Omicron COVID-19 Variant Detected on Siksika Nation

The Omicron variant of COVID-19 has been detected on Siksika Nation. Our Siksika Health teams will continue to monitor the situation and offer support and guidance to those affected.

Siksikawa, from the very start of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has taken all of us working together to keep our community safe. We take pride in sharing information with you and are committed to always share and remain transparent when information becomes available, so that we can all make good choices for the health and safety of ourselves and others.

The Omicron variant of COVID-19 poses a new risk for Siksika Nation. Omicron is a highly mutated strain of COVID-19 and has developed the ability to evade some of the protection offered by vaccines. Current research suggests that two doses of either Pfizer or Moderna offers only a 33% chance of protection against infection from Omicron, but still provides 70% protection from severe outcomes. This means 2 doses of vaccine is not highly protective against catching and spreading Omicron, but will still reduce the severity of the illness. Fortunately, a booster dose (third dose) of Moderna or Pfizer will increase protection against infection to 75% and further improve protection against severe illness. Please take the opportunity to get vaccinated as soon as possible; it will help protect you, your family, 8and the Siksika community.

Omicron COVID-19 Variant Detected on Siksika Nation

- Extremely infectious compared to other COVID-19 variants
- Currently spreading rapidly throughout Canada and Alberta
- Potential to put strain on our healthcare systems due to rapid spread

The best way to protect yourself and others against all current and any future strains of COVID-19 is to get fully vaccinated.



The COVID-19 Response Unit serves Siksika Nation and our friends on a daily basis.

Case numbers have been on the rise, and so too has the number of people seeking testing. We humbly ask you to please be patient and kind to our teams when utilizing our services as they are doing their best for you.

If you or someone you know is sick or has symptoms that might seem like a cold or flu, Please stay home and away from others, and get a PCR test as soon as possible, even if a rapid test result comes back negative.

PCR testing is available by drive-thru between 10:00am-1:00pm daily, or by calling the COVID-19 Response Unit (CRU) dispatch at 403-734-5688, 7 days per week.



Siksika Health Services Leads The Way

A relatively new treatment to fight severe COVID-19 outcomes is being used on Siksika Nation in what is believed to be the first doses of monoclonal antibody treatment to be administered on a First Nation in Canada.

So, what is it exactly?

"Sotrovimab is an antiviral/monoclonal antibody given through IV infusion for to those experiencing mild to moderate symptoms from COVID-19 infection, and is designed to reduce negative health outcomes and reduce hospitalizations," Charlene Brough, Nurse Practitioner and Nursing Advisor for Siksika Health Services explains.

At this point on Siksika
Nation, two patients have
received the treatment,
administered by Siksika
Health's Community
Paramedics (CPs), who
deliver a broad range of
diagnostic and treatment
services for Siksika Nation,
often remotely or within
patients' homes. The team
of CPs are specially trained
to provide short-term
assessment and treatment

for low-acuity illnesses, including sotrovimab, under the medical direction of Physicians and Nurse Practitioners.

"Through our partnerships with Alberta Health. AHS, and of course being supported by the Medical Officers of Health with Indigenous Services Canada, we knew this medication and treatment option was coming," says Brough. "Thankfully, our Community Paramedics, within their scope of practice, can give IV infusions. We just needed to obtain the actual medication and refine protocols specific to Siksika."

Sotrovimab is a Schedule I antiviral/monoclonal antibody, developed by GlaxoSmithKline Inc., that received Health Canada emergency use authorization in July 2021 for the treatment of mild to moderate COVID-19. It has been shown to be most effective when administered before the virus has progressed beyond a mild to moderate infection, therefore, individuals who

have COVID-like symptoms are being advised to get tested as early as possible (once signs/symptoms develop) to allow sufficient time to determine potential eligibility for sotrovimab treatment.

In an attempt to reduce the negative health effects and poor health outcomes of COVID-19, Siksika Health Services alongside provincial (Alberta Health and Alberta Health Services) and federal (Health Canada and Indigenous Services Canada) partners have developed an expedited approach to offer sotrovimab to Siksika Nation Members

In Alberta, sotrovimab is currently available for specific, eligible people who have a PCR confirmed COVID-19 infection, including: those with preexisting health conditions, for example people with diabetes who require medication, chronic kidney disease, congestive heart failure, or an inflammatory condition;

in First Nation COVID-19 Treatment

some unvaccinated individuals; and immunocompromised people who have had a transplant or received chemotherapy or other immunosuppressive treatment since December 2020.

Importantly, sotrovimab does not replace COVID-19 vaccination. Siksika Health Services strongly encourages all Siksika Nation members. and all people, to receive the vaccine doses they are eligible for, as soon as possible, In addition to immunization, which is available daily on weekdays at Siksika Nation's Immunization Clinic and via the mobile Immunization Special Forces vehicle, Siksika Health Services plans to continue using the monoclonal antibody treatment when necessary and possible.

COVID-19 PCR Terting Eligibility



Siksika Health Services has revised its COVID-19 PCR testing eligibility to help ensure access and availability for highrisk and priority populations.

Siksika's COVID-19 PCR testing is now available for eligible Siksika Nation members, and for those who live or work on Siksika Nation. Eligible individuals include:

- ~ People who are experiencing illness symptoms
- ~ People who have tested positive with a home COVID-19 rapid test
- ~ Close contacts of people who have tested positive for COVID-19

PCR testing is available by drive-thru at the facility near the Deerfoot Sportsplex between 10:00am-1:00pm daily, or in-home by calling the COVID-19 Response Unit (CRU) dispatch at 403-734-5688, 7 days per week.




Siksika Nation moved to a COVID-19 RED - HIGH RISK level


On January 14, 2022 Siksika Nation moved to a COVID-19 RED - HIGH RISK level.
