POSITION SUMMARY

Siksika Health Services is seeking a Community Care Paramedic Team Lead to join our Aisokinaipiyokiiks (Community Care) Paramedic Team. CP Team Lead are integral members of Siksika's Clinical Services team, providing medical supervision and treatment for patients in the community, for new or chronic health concerns not well managed due to homelessness, mental health, addiction, physical mobility, transportation, or other barriers to care.

Responsibilities include, but will not be limited to:

- Work with the responsible physician or nurse practitioner to deliver medical services for non-emergent health needs, including those related to mental health and addictions. These would include a broad scope of primary care services for point-of-care assessment, diagnosis and treatment in the community.
- Collaborate with the medical clinic, EMS, Siksika Crisis Response, NNADAP and opioid teams, other Siksika services areas (Homecare, Community Wellness, Community Health) to deliver patient centered primary care, as part of an integrated system of services.
- The willingness to assume ultimate accountability to the Nursing Advisor (NP) and Corporate Executive Office (E.C.O.) for any delegated task result and outcomes.
- Responsible for the preparation and supervision of annual workplans goals and budgets.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Education and Experience:

- Must hold current, unrestricted registration with the Alberta College of Paramedics as an EMT-P.
- Must have experience caring for patients with addictions, mental health and concurrent conditioners.
- Must be able to assess and respond to mental health risk and consider the issues that impact patient and provider decision making.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Must understand professional and ethical standards of practice (confidentiality, privacy, documentation, professional boundaries).
- Must have a good understanding of health and safety in the workplace (violence in the workplace, self-care and suicide awareness)
- Must have strong verbal communication skills.
